MEET LEE ELLERY – RPB VOLUNTEER REPRESENTATIVE

Introducing some of the key players within the Partnership is becoming a regular feature of our Newsletter, and this time it's the turn of Lee Ellery, a Volunteer Representative on the Regional Partnership Board. Here's what he had to say...

Hi Lee, please tell us a bit about yourself...

Hi, I'm Lee from Swansea and I'm 40 years old. I have Cerebral Palsy and I currently work for The Shaw Trust Accessibility Services team. My role is to assess websites to ensure they are accessible for disabled users.

I also volunteer with a range of organisations, including the West Glamorgan Regional Partnership as a Volunteer Representative on the Regional Partnership Board.

Do you enjoy what you do?

Very much so. Whether I'm participating as a volunteer or in a paid capacity, I'm passionate about making a difference to the lives of others. I'm a proud Ambassador for Cerebral Palsy Cymru, which requires me to ensure decision makers are aware of the issues affecting real

people and to challenge decisions, when needed. Elevating the voices of those who aren't always able to speak up is vital. I try my best to ensure service planning is inclusive and that the needs of disabled people are taken into consideration.

What is your favourite thing about volunteering with West Glamorgan?

I think it's having the opportunity to be proactive in my community, and knowing that my contributions are helping to make life better for the residents of our region. It's a great feeling.

Is there anything you think could be done better?

Although there are many benefits to being able to hold meetings online, I think we should take more opportunities to get out and about in community spaces to connect with people who may not be aware of the Partnership's work. This could mean linking with other organisations when they hold events, or running more of our own.

I realise these things can be costly and this is a challenging financial climate, but being more visible in the community would help spread the word about the work we do and how people can get involved.

Finally, why do you think it's important to have Volunteer Representatives on the Regional Partnership Board?

Involving real people in the development and delivery of services that affect them is a must. It's all in the spirit of co-production, which we've worked hard to embed into the regional programmes of work. While there's always more work to be done, I'm very proud to have been a part of what we've achieved so far and look forward to seeing more progress in 2025.


ANNUAL REPORT 2023-24

DRIVING CHANGE IN WEST GLAMORGAN

In the last edition of our Newsletter, we featured an item on the **Learning Disability Strategy** for 2024-2029 and highlighted **'Transport'** as being the initial area of focus to improve the experiences of people with a Learning Disability when travelling on public transport.

A co-produced workshop on the theme of 'Transport' was held over the summer, and our Communications and Engagement team have produced a short video documenting the progress of this key piece of work.



The video captures the process of putting the workshop together, gathering the views of public transport users and representatives from public transport service providers.

We are excited to share this film, which is now available to watch on our Vimeo channel (click here) or by scanning the QR code above.

The video offers a valuable insight into the collaborative efforts taken to address this priority theme. The project has opened new channels of communication between users of services and providers, offering a better understanding of the challenges and providing potential solutions.

TRAVEL CHARTER

A key outcome of the workshop is the development of a **'Travel Charter'** in collaboration with the Community Transport Association. This will outline shared commitments and goals to improve accessibility, ensuring that the voices of people with Learning Disabilities are central to creating a more inclusive transport network across our region.
